VOLUNTEER FIELD ASSISTANT

Buenos Aires, Argentina

Volunteers are needed from 5 October 2006 through 5 March 2007 for a long-term project monitoring Sand Dune Lizard (*Liolaemus multimaculatus*) ecology in the Coast Dunes of Buenos Aires Province (Mar Chiquita Biosphere Reserve), Argentina. This great opportunity allows applicants to get to know some of Argentina while gaining experience in a variety of field herpetology methodologies. Duties include daily census assistance (line transect), territory spot mapping, marking, conducting behavioral observations, conducting insect censuses, and data entry. Applicants must be responsible, self-disciplined, willing to work in a group, and able to stay at a remote location without long distance communications facilities such as phones or internet. The setting at the reserve is basic (rustic conditions). Applicants with field work experience and Spanish language capability may be preferred but these skills are not required. We provide lodging and necessary equipment. Volunteers must arrange their own transportation to Mar del Plata – Buenos Aires Province (buses from Buenos Aires daily) and are required to pay approx. US \$65/ week.
